## Davenport, Iowa by Miss Martha Wing, Deaconess-in-Charge

Rev. James R. Adams, Elder of the Branch of the Christian Catholic Church at Waterloo, Iowa, has recently been conducting special missions at Davenport and at Webster City. That God wonderfully blessed these missions is evident from the enthusiastic reports that have been sent in from these points. The following letter from Deaconess Wing shows that quite a spirit of interest has been aroused in the three sister cities, Davenport, Rock Island, and Moline.

Elder James R. Adams, Waterloo, Iowa, has just closed a series of meetings in Davenport and Moline, Illinois, and as I have never sent an account of our work of this Branch of the Church in the three cities, Davenport, Rock Island, and Moline, I take the opportunity to do so in connection with a report of these meetings. Early in the summer we organized more systematic house-to-house "Seventy" work, which we have continued faithfully, but found the majority of people indifferent and unresponsive. It being so hard to give the LEAVES to any one, we thought it impossible to sell, but just before Elder Adams came we organized for Saturday night work, and found that, though we cannot give the LEAVES away in Davenport, we have met with very fair success in selling them. We disposed of about four hundred and fifty copies during this mission, under Elder Adams' instruction and encouragement.

For inexperienced workers in a new field we felt God has blessed us, and trust that it is only the beginning of better work. These meetings have taught us a valuable lesson, which may be of assistance to some. Gatherings that are calling for an Elder to "start the work." We distributed some thousands of notices, but so far as I was able to measure the audiences, I should say there were hardly a dozen who attended outside of those who had been reached through the LEAVES by the individual work of our Seventies and members. Even street meetings brought little or no result. I think there will never again be a question as to the way to reach people here. The LEAVES OF HEALING magazine is the best worker. We thank God for the wonderful Little White Dove.

We found Elder Adams to be a man who knows how to fight for God, so I do not wonder Satan bates him. The meetings were full of blessing. The interest gradually increased, until, toward the close of the series, many were seeking the truth. At the last meeting in Davenport, held Lord's Day evening, as the people passed out, strangers on all sides were heard expressing regret that they had failed to attend earlier. We believe an opening wedge has entered, and that it is only the beginning of greater work for God through the three cities. But we feel that not the least part of Elder Adams' mission here was the help and instruction we received as to the best way of conducting work, and the advice and encouragement he gave individual members. We have all received abundant blessing and thank God for the privilege of having been, even for so short a time, under the leadership of so earnest a worker, May God bless him abundantly and use him still further in the extension of the Kingdom is the prayer of all our hearts.

The appended testimonies reported by Elder Adams will give some idea of God's blessing upon the work in this place during the past year: "Ye shall be

My Witnesses both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and unto the utter-most part of the earth." This is fulfilled in Zion. God's Witnesses send forth "the word of their testimony" from Zion. In doing so, they receive God's reward and bring the priceless blessings of Salvation and Healing to thousands and tens of thousands of the sinful and sick. God is even compelling the enemies of Zion to acknowledge the effectiveness of her witnessing, as the remarks of a Davenport druggist to a Seventy worker will show. Said he, "No, I will not buy the paper. You people and we are in competition, and you are getting much the best of it."

In September I conducted a mission in Davenport, which God greatly blessed. The appended report of a testimony meeting contains true and grateful words from the lips of those whom the ever-loving Father has saved, healed, cleansed, and honored in Zion.

Miss Elizabeth Sansom, 1714 Eighth Avenue, Moline, Illinois, said: "God has done a great deal for me through Zion. I had gone far away from Him and was in deep spiritual darkness. But this teaching reached me. I repented and made things right with God and man, I came into Zion and rejoice to testify to the blessings I have received. Pray that God will continue to bless me."

Miss Florence Wheelock, 836 East Thirteenth Street, Davenport, Iowa, said: "I thank God for Zion. I wish all to know what God is to us in Zion. For nearly three years I have had diseased and weak eyes. God has restored me so that I have been enabled to lay aside my glasses almost entirely.
