Deaf Hear, Dumb Speak, Others Healed and Saved.

God Stretches Forth His Hand to Heal.

One of the first notable healings was that of Arthur Lee Haltar, 145 N. Main St., who is now 21 years of age, born deaf and dumb. He had been to a deaf and dumb school and for the first time was able to speak and hear after prayer on July 29. Praise God! He said, "God," and other words quite plainly and listened to the music. He goes to the store now and buys bread without the aid of pencil and paper. His mother heard him for the first time say, "Mother." He also read John 3:16 for me. His father was reclaimed and others raised their hands for salvation after beholding the miracle.

Two More Deaf and Dumb Healed.

Miss Luella Beecher, aged 22, of Canaseraga, a few miles from Hornell, came for prayer. She had been dcaf and dumb for 20 years. When she left the meeting I said, "God bless you," and she replied, "God bless you."

Another miracle was that of Fred House, of Ayoca, N. Y., deaf and dumb for 55 years, now 57 years of age. I wish every one could have looked upon the face of this dear man as he stood beside the piano listening to the music. His face lit up and he raised his head toward heaven. The audience arose praising God. Glory! Glory! Yea, all the glory is due unto our God and the Lord Jesus Christ our Saviour! Many others were instantly healed. One mother could hardly contain herself. She had us weeping as she rejoiced over the healing of her daughter.

People came from far and near from morning till night, till we thought of the scripture, "they had no leisure so much as to eat." Catholics would come and promise not to bow down before images any more. Christian Scientists (so-called), who nad tried to make themselves believe they were not sick, came to be prayed for and promised to destroy their books.

In discussing the case with an Advertiser reporter, Mr. Kellner said:

"Last night he came to the meeting. We talked for a few minutes by writing on paper. He was accompanied by his mother and several relatives or neighbors. They told me he was deaf and dumb and had never lisped a word since birth. He was peculiarly afflicted because many deaf mutes are able to mumble something or other. I agreed to do what could be done for him.

"Before we left the tent young Halter could both speak and hear. He answered me in the best way he could. To demonstrate that he could hear we even carried

on a conversation in whispers. He heard every word."

The second paper reports two other healings as follows:

Franklin Harwood, of No. 212 Madison Avenue, Hornell, had for years been deaf in one car. He attended one of the Kellner meetings, an Elmira paper stated, and at the close of the meeting could hear with both ears. He pleaded with those in charge of the meeting to go to his home, where his son lay at the point of death. He had that afternoon been given up by a council of physicians. The next morning he was on the road to recovery.

Mrs. Susan Havens, aged 72 years, attended a meeting, carrying with her an ear trumpet which she had used for many years. Before she left the tent, she gave away her ear trumpet and conversed with many present who spoke in ordinary tones.

PENTECOSTAL REVIVALS IN GREAT BRITAIN AND NORWAY.

Mrs. Lily Denham of Thornton Heath, London is being much used of God. For over twenty years she has worked up and down the country as an evangelist and was successful in getting multitudes of people saved, notwithstanding the fact that she suffered from a weak heart.

At a Pentecostal convention in London she received the baptism of the Holy Spirit, and since then has been much used in divine healing.
